

COVID-19 PANDEMIC ACTION PLAN: Under Sixty Cod Harvesters

PURPOSE:	The purpose of this plan is to address the national pandemic and adhere to the latest mandate issued by the State of Alaska. The mandate requires all Alaska companies to take an active role in mitigating the risk to Alaska for community transmission. This mandate includes exercising 14-days of quarantine in Alaska prior to mobilizing to a worksite, with the exception of mission critical personnel, for whom rigorous safety precautions will be put in place. (Mission critical personnel exempted under SOA March 23 COVID-19 Health Mandate 010: International and Interstate Travel, Order for Self Quarantine, Attachment A, Section “g”.)
SCOPE:	This action plan covers all member businesses of the Under Sixty Cod Harvesters trade organization (501(c)5).
DEFINITIONS:	<p>The following are defined by Center for Disease Control and Prevention and/or World Health Organization (WHO):</p> <p><u>Confirmed/Suspect COVID-19:</u> A person who has tested positive for COVID-19 or a person who satisfies epidemiological and clinical criteria.</p> <p><u>Close Contact:</u> Greater than 15 minutes face-to-face contact in any setting with a confirmed case in the period extending from 24 hours before onset of symptoms in the confirmed case, or sharing of a closed space with a confirmed case for a prolonged period (e.g. more than 2 hours) in the period extending from 24 hours before onset of symptoms in the confirmed case.</p> <p>A close contact includes a person meeting any of the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Living in the same household or household-like setting (e.g. in a boarding school or hostel).Direct contact with the body fluids or laboratory specimens of a case without recommended PPE or failure of PPE.Aircraft passengers who were seated in the same row as the case, or in the two rows in front or two rows behind a confirmed COVID-19 case. Contact tracing of people who may have had close contact on long bus or train trips should also be attempted where possible, using similar seating/proximity criteria. <p>Contact needs to have occurred within the period extending 24 hours before onset of symptoms in the case until the case is classified as no longer infectious by the treating team.</p> <p>Note that healthcare workers and other contacts who have taken recommended infection control precautions, including the use of full PPE, while caring for a symptomatic confirmed COVID-19 case are not considered to be close contacts.</p> <p><u>Workspace:</u> On commercial fishing operations, the entire vessel is considered a workspace, as is any other work or shop area where essential duties for vessel functioning are conducted.</p>

	<p><u>Isolation:</u> Separates sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick.</p> <p><u>Quarantine:</u> Separates and restricts the movement of people who were exposed or potentially exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick.</p> <p><u>Signs & Symptoms:</u> Fever, sore throat, cough, shortness of breath, chills, body aches, headache, abdominal pain, diarrhea, vomiting.</p>
EFFECTIVE DATE:	March 25, 2020
BASIC CONTROLS	<p>Employees/contractors will be given an overview of proper hygiene practices for prevention including handwashing, and workplace cleaning and disinfecting measures.</p> <p>Employees/contractors will practice physical/social distancing except in cases where to do so would result in danger or harm to person or vessel.</p> <p>Employees/contractors will not engage in non-essential travel.</p> <p>Employees/contractors will be regularly updated on best practices, CDC recommendations, state and federal mandates and other educational information aimed at disease prevention.</p> <p>Employees/contractors will maintain 6' of distance at all times with all other people outside of essential workspaces.</p> <p>Trips outside workspaces will be minimized to include only essential duties and supply, and employees/contractors will practice all CDC recommended community protocols for prevention (i.e. grocery store, gear shops, etc.)</p>
OPERATIONAL CONTROLS:	<p>Work spaces will undergo regular sanitation measures as recommended by the CDC.</p> <p>Employees/contractors will follow CDC guidelines for group meetings, and maintain 6 feet of distance at all times with persons outside of the essential workspaces.</p> <p>Employees/contractors will practice physical/social distancing except in cases where to do so would result in danger or harm to person or vessel.</p> <p>No visitors are allowed on board the vessel or in other essential workspaces. Workspaces restricted to mission critical personnel only.</p>
PREVENTATIVE CONTROLS:	Employees/contractors will answer health and travel questions prior to travel, and again after arrival.

	Any employees/contractors exhibiting symptoms will immediately follow CDC recommendations for isolation and treatment if necessary.
MANDATE CONTROLS:	See below re: fishing vessel employee exemptions for essential infrastructure.
MISSION CRITICAL PERSONNEL	All vessel employees/contractors are considered mission critical to safety and food production, an essential infrastructure business per SOA March 23 COVID-19 Health Mandate 010: International and Interstate Travel, Order for Self Quarantine, Attachment A, Section "g").
